Brigadier General (BG) Ural D. Glanville was born in Columbus, Ohio. In 1982, he enrolled at the University of Georgia (UGA) and joined the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps program. In 1984, he graduated from UGA and was commissioned as an Infantry Second Lieutenant, beginning his 33 years of military service. BG Glanville delayed his military service to attend law school at UGA. After completing his Juris Doctor Degree, he served on active duty from 1990-1993. His active duty assignments include service with the United States Army Trial Defense Service and Trial Counsel for V Corps in Germany. In 1993, BG Glanville returned to Atlanta, Georgia and resumed service with the Army Reserves.

Prior to serving as the Commanding General for the United States Army Reserve Legal Command, Gaithersburg, Maryland, BG Glanville served as the Assistant Judge Advocate General for Military Law and Operations Individual Mobilization Augmentee, Headquarters, Department of the Army, Pentagon, Washington, DC; Chief Judge, Army Court of Criminal Appeals, US Army Legal Services Agency, Fort Belvoir, Virginia; Commanding General North Atlantic Treaty Organization Rule of Law Support Mission/Rule of Law Field Force-Afghanistan; Commander, 213th Legal Operations Detachment (LOD), Decatur, Georgia; Staff Judge Advocate, 335th Signal Command, East Point, Georgia and OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM; Command Judge Advocate, 359th Signal Brigade, Fort Gordon, Georgia; Chief of Operational and Civil Law, 2125th Garrison Support Unit, XVIII Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; and, Senior Legal Opinions Officer and other positions, 213th LOD, Decatur, Georgia.

As a civilian, Judge Glanville has served as a prosecutor, criminal defense attorney and as a civil litigator. In 1996, he began his judicial service as a Magistrate Judge in Fulton County State Court. In 2004, after eight years a Magistrate, he became a Superior Court Judge in Fulton County, Georgia's busiest trial court of general jurisdiction. Judge Glanville's duties include trial of cases involving felony offenses, divorce, equity and cases regarding title to land. His responsibilities also includes presiding over administrative appeals and jury trials.

BG Glanville is married and has two children.
